



CLUBS MAKING SUBMISSIONS ON ISSUES

Clubs should nominate a person(s) to keep up to date with matters that may pose a risk to local club activities. This could be in and on the water or the land where the club runs from.

Talk to local your councils. Clubs should be on the list of “Interested Parties” so they will be notified when anyone submits an application for resource consent that is of concern to them. Also, by talking to the council, it puts the club in a better position for consultations with councils on projects.

Make sure your club and members make submissions on issues they wish to be heard on. If you do not make a submission, you cannot get involved in proceedings later on, or appeal any decisions.

This is a notification service. When any application for a marine farm is submitted it has to pass a UAE test (Undue Adverse Effects test – fishing related), which means you will receive an email on any new application and can check if it is in your area.
