Submission to the NRC on Westpac Mussels Distributors Ltd. Application for a 125ha Mussel farm at Stephenson Island, near Whangaroa Harbour (CON20112937101)

6. Yachting New Zealand opposes this application.

Yachting New Zealand (YNZ) is the national sports organisation (NSO) which represents 31,000 members in 123 yacht clubs from Taipa in the north to Bluff in the south – also affiliated are 50 class associations and 40 maritime associations. Many boaties are involved in both power and sail driven activities.

The reasons we opposed this application are as follows:

- The size of the farm is too large. The proposed farm would take up almost the entire easterly bays of Stephenson Island preventing any other boating users from accessing these bays for recreation or safety.
- It should be noted that marine farms have an influence over a wider area than their immediate footprint. For example, it is illegal for example vessels to empty holding tanks within 1 kilometre of a marine farm. Whangaroa Harbour is already very restricted as to where holding tanks can be emptied. This farm would further restrict activities in the area.
- The bay in which the farm is proposed to be located provides sheltered anchorage in Northerly to South South-Easterly winds.
- The entrance to Whangaroa Harbour is narrow and can be a particularly treacherous passage in certain conditions, seven crew of the yacht “Lionheart” perished when their yacht ran aground trying to enter the harbour on June 6 1983 at night in rough weather. The inside of Stephenson Island is the only nearby lee shore where boats who are unable to enter the harbour in these conditions to take refuge and wait till the conditions allow them to enter the harbour. The size of the farm would exclude yachts and other boats from seeking shelter when needed.
- The position of the farm obstructs long recognised navigational paths along the Northland coast.
- Visual pollution impact on an area of natural beauty.
- Northland Regional Council is still working through Plan Change 4 which deals with allocating space for new aquaculture developments.
