NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part 1 shall apply.
- 1.3 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official notice board located in the CBYC Club House.
- 1.4 Appendix T will apply.
- 1.5 3 starters are required to constitute a class. Classes with insufficient entries will be sailed as D Class.
- 1.6 SIAG is a training Regatta and coaching and instruction may be given by sailing committee approved coaches. This alters RRS 41.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to all youth classes.
- 2.2 Eligible boats may enter via [ClubHub](#) or at the [CBYC website Home Page](#) by 17th January 2019.
- 2.3 To be eligible to compete in this event each entrant and crew member shall be a financial member of a club recognised by the entrant and crew member's national authority.

3 FEES

- 3.1 Required fees are as follows:

- 3.2 Entries received after 17th January 2019 may be required to pay an additional late entry fee of \$10.

4 SCHEDULE

- 4.1 Registration: Saturday 19th January from 1030 at the CBYC Club House.

4.2 Briefing: Saturday 19th January at 1130 at the CBYC Club House.

4.3 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race is 1225 on Saturday and 1255 on Sunday.

4.4 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 1700.

5 MEASUREMENT

A boat shall comply with RRS 78.1 at 0800 January 19th.

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing instructions will be available after 1800 January 12th on the CBYC web site.

7 VENUE

Attachment A shows the location of the racing areas.

8 THE COURSES

The diagrams in Attachment B show the courses, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

9 PENALTY SYSTEM

Decisions of the protest committee will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.

10 SCORING

10.1 3 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

10.2 Classes will be scored together with results being based on competitor age as defined at time of entry.

10.3

a) When fewer than 3 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

b) When 3 to 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

11 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones. [DP]

12 PRIZES

Prizes will be given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each age group

13 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

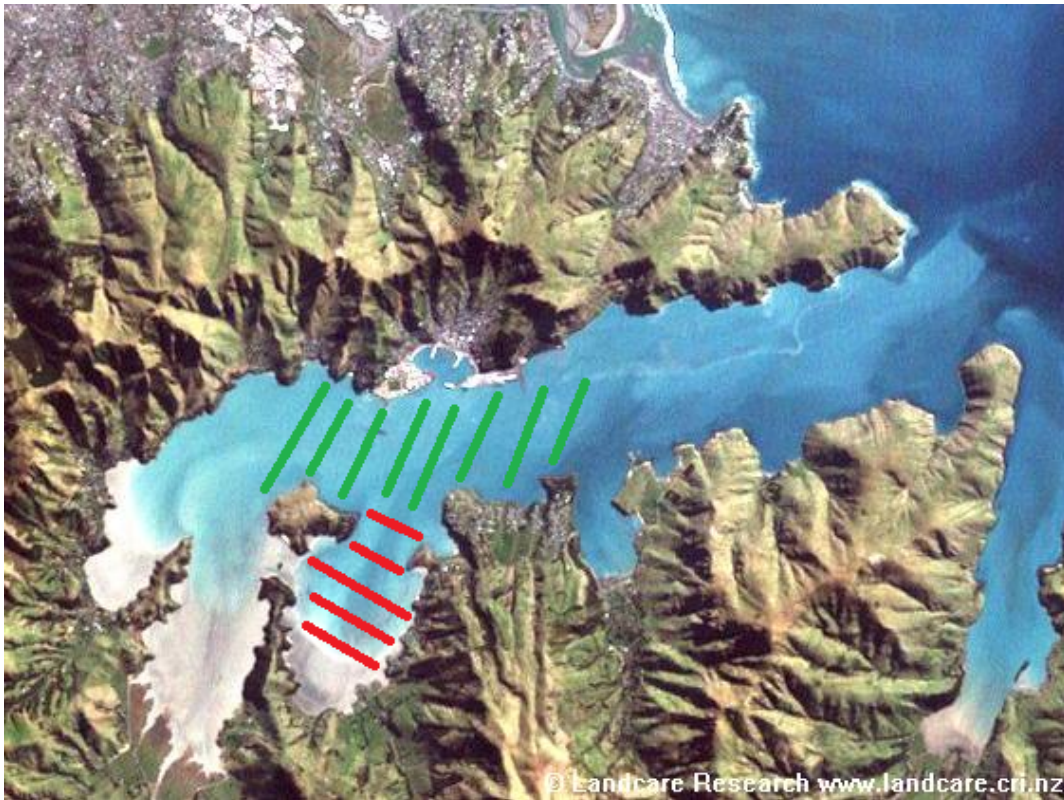

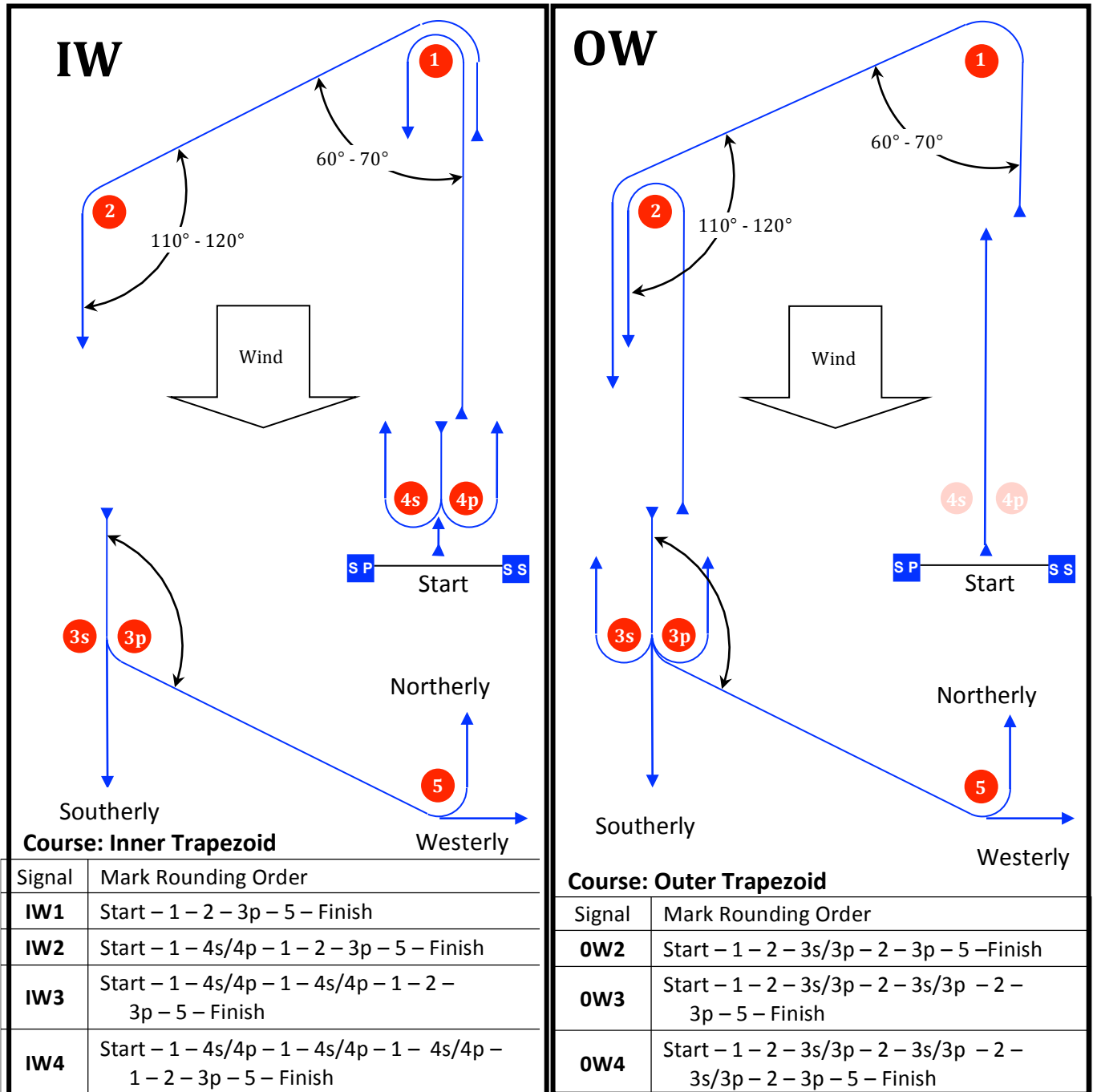
Attachment A - Course Area

Mark	Description
1	Yellow Cylindrical
2	Orange Cylindrical
3s 3p	Orange Cylindrical
4s 4p	Orange Spherical
5	Orange Cylindrical
SS Starting mark starboard end	Committee Boat Te Wharau
SP Starting mark port end	Orange Spherical
Finishing mark outer	Red and white stripped staff with three pink spheres on top
Finishing mark inner	Red and white stripped staff on the CBYC start box. Competitors must pass through the line on the seaward side of the inner distance mark (red spherical buoy).
