Notice of Race (NoR)

- 1 RULES
- *The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- **1.2** The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part 1 shall apply.
- **2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**
- **2.1** The sailing instructions will be available at registration.
- **2.2** The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official notice board located at PPYC.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- **3.1** The event is open to all dinghies and 'estuary able' multihulls and trailer yachts.
- **3.2** Three boats starting will constitute a class. Where there are not three boats of a class, divisions will be:

Multihulls

Open A (eg Sigrid, Zephyr, Europe, Laser)

Open B (eg Farr 5, Sunburst, Starling)

Open C (eg Firebug, P, Opti)

- **3.3** Eligible boats may enter by completing the PPYC entry form at Registration.
- **3.4** The following crew limitations apply: *female skippers and for multiple handed boats at least one female crew member.*

- **4.3** The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race is *1045*.
- **4.4** No warning signal will be made after *12.15*.

5 VENUE

- **5.1** Pleasant Point Yacht Club, South New Brighton Park, Beatty Street, Christchurch.
- **5.2** The racing area will be on waters of the Avon Heathcote Estuary in the vicinity of Pleasant Point Yacht Club.

6 COURSES

- **6.1** Courses for the day will be displayed on the board outside the Race office and described by the Race Office at the briefing.
- **6.2** The courses will be posted on the official noticeboard no later than 30 minutes before the warning signal.

7 MARKS

7.1 Course marks will be club and Estuary fixed marks. The start finish mark will be a pink and yellow spherical buoy.

8 PENALTY SYSTEM

8.1 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

9 SCORING

- **9.1** A boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores.
- **9.2** For the handicap trophy a boat's handicap will be established by the results of the first race.

10 SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

10.1 Support person vessels must register with the Race Officer and comply with any instruction.

11 RISK STATEMENT

11.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, or other causes.

12 PRIZES

12.1 Prizes will be given as follows:

Margaret Kennett Memorial Trophy – overall winner on handicap.

Wāhine on the Water Line Honours Pennants will be awarded to the first place boat in each class, or Division where there are insufficient boats for a class.
