# Notice of Race (NoR)

- 1 RULES
- **1.1** The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- **1.2** The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations 2021 2024 Part 1 shall apply.
- **1.3** Appendix T, Arbitration will apply.

#### 2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- **2.1** The sailing instructions will be available from 16<sup>th</sup> January 2023 on the A Class Web Site: www.aclass.org.nz
- **2.2** The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official notice board located at Turangi Yacht Club at Turangi

#### **3** COMMUNICATION

- **3.1** The Official Notice Board is located at the Turangi Yacht Club House.
- **3.2** [DP] A boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

### 4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- **4.1** A Class Nationals are open to A Class boats that comply with the A Class Rules and a current financial member of the NZ A Class Association.
- **4.2** A Class boats that wish to be eligible for the Classic Division must comply with the International A Class Rules C.2 for the Classic Discipline.
- **4.3** Tornado Nationals are open to Tornado boats that comply with the Tornado Rules and be a current financial member of the NZ Tornado Association.
- **4.4** A competitor shall be a current financial member of a club or other organisation affiliated to Yachting New Zealand.
- **4.5** Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form and submitting it, together with the required fee, to <u>turangisailor@yahoo.co.nz</u> by Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2023.
- **4.6** Late entries will be accepted with a Late Entry Fee up until 2000 Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> March 2023.

- **7.5** The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day is 10.55.
- 7.6 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 1425.

#### 8 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- **8.1** Each boat shall produce or verify the existence of a valid measurement certificate.
- **8.2** Boats may be inspected by a Class Official Measurer at any time.
- 8.3 Sails and Hulls must display the correct Sail Number assigned to the boat.
- 8.4 Launching Trolleys and Dumps should also have the sail number marked on them.

#### 9 VENUE

- **9.1** Addendum 1 shows the plan of the event venue.
- **9.2** Addendum 2 shows the location of the racing areas.

## 10 COURSES

- **10.1** The course(s) to be sailed will be of type Windward/Leeward
- **10.2** Course diagrams / descriptions and mark descriptions will be outlined in the Sailing Instructions.

#### **11 PENALTY SYSTEM**

**11.2** RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

#### 12 SCORING

- **12.1** 5 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- **12.2** (a) When fewer than 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

(b) When from 6 to 8 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

(c) When 9 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

#### 13 SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

- **13.1** Support vessels will be allowed but must register with the Organising Authority at Registration, attend briefing and comply with local bylaws.
- **13.2** Support vessels must stay at least 50 metres outside the racecourse area, except for those responding to a request for assistance by the race committee.
- **13.3** Support vessels are required to have VHF communications and be available to assist the race committee when required
- **13.4** All support person vessels shall always have an engine safety cut out switch (kill cord) attached to the driver while the engine is running, unless prior written exemption has been provided by the Organising Authority.

#### 14 RISK STATEMENT

**14.1** RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors,

poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

## 15 INSURANCE

**15.1** Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$1,000,000 per incident or the equivalent. Certificate of insurance is to be presented at registration.

## 16 PRIZES

**16.1** Prizes will be awarded as follows:

A Class Nationals:

- 1st Open Division Trophy
- Open Division medals: 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>
- 1st Classic Division Trophy
- Classics Division medals: 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>
- 1st Veteran Division (over 55) Trophy
- Veteran Division medals: 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>
- Junior (under 25) Medal: 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>
- Winner of 1st Race The Murray Philpott Memorial Trophy
- Ken Urquhart Trophy for "Good sportsmanship"

Tornado Nationals:

- 1st Place The Moore Trophy
  Open Division places: 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>
- The Pro Marine Tornado Trophy 1<sup>st</sup> Tornado with an aluminium mast

**16.2** Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Classes or Organising Authority.
