HCSP has seen over 25 years of successful sailing instruction, with many junior sailors developing their sailing skills through our programs each season. We are a dedicated and well-established Club and Sailing & Powerboating School, promoting safe boating for all. Conveniently located in downtown Toronto, immediately south of the Rogers Centre and CN Tower, our clubhouse has access to over 60 sail and power craft, ranging from 7' to 35' in length, including 27 Dinghies ranging from 420s to our Hobies, Picos and RS Zests and RS Fevas.

We are looking for responsible, experienced, and motivated individuals who can demonstrate energy, enthusiasm, and the ability to relate to children, young people and adults. We are also looking for team players who are able to interchange with the various Sailing Camp programs that we offer, and act as role model for our young sailors, creating a positive learning experience and nurturing environment.

For the instructor positions a minimum or equivalent of CANSail 1&2 Instructor Sail Canada certification (or governing body equivalent RYA, ASA etc) and powerboat experienced is required. To be able to teach with us you must be a registered instructor in good standing with Sail Canada. The Camp Counsellor positions do not require instructor certification, but boating knowledge would be an asset, and previous experience working with children is required.

We welcome LOCAL, NATIONAL and INTERNATIONAL candidates who meet the following requirements:

- Available to work from June 20 to August 30, 2024
- Hold a teaching qualification in the applicable CANSail Instructor level (or are in process for completion before July 1)
- To be at least 16 years old, as of June 29, 2024
- Strong sail programming, leadership, and organisational skills
- Current First Aid, CPR certification & Boat Safety certification
- Enjoy working with children and youth, and previous experience working in a camp setting is an asset
- Police Check and Vulnerable Sector Screening (we can assist with this)
- Hold a valid Toronto Harbour Licence, VHF-DSC License, and a Pleasure Craft Operators Card (we can assist with these)
- Keelboat, racing and regatta experience are assets
- International candidates must have, or be in the process of gaining, a valid Canadian work permit
