Notice of Race

The notation '[DP]' at the beginning of a rule is subject to discretionary penalty (see RRS Introduction Notation).

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1 Rules

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 Safety regulations:
 - a. Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations 2021–2024 Part II Category 5 shall apply to **keel boats** and **multihulls**, and the minimum amount of engine fuel to be carried at the start of each day shall be LWL(m) /0.4.
 - b. Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations 2021–2024 Part V Category A shall apply to **trailer yachts**, and a minimum of ten (10) litres of engine fuel shall be carried at the start of each day.
 - c. Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations 2021–2024 Part VI Category A shall apply to **sports boats**, and a minimum of ten (10) litres of engine fuel shall be carried at the start of each day.
 - d. Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations 2021-2024 Part 1 amended to include an operative waterproof VHF transceiver, Part V paragraphs 2.01 to 2.04, and SR Appendix 4 shall apply to **Elliot 6m** class yachts.
 - e. The Race Committee may direct Elliot 6m class yachts not to compete in any given race due to adverse weather conditions. A decision to give or not give such direction will not be grounds for redress. This changes rule 62.1(a).
 - f. All boats shall carry a serviceable inboard or outboard engine and propeller capable of driving the boat in smooth water at a speed exceeding 4 knots.
- 1.3 The Wellington Regional Navigation Safety Bylaws 2021 will apply.

- 1.4 The RRS will be changed as follows.
 - a. [NP] Boats with lifting keels shall have keels locked in the down position and not moved whilst racing. This changes RRS 51 (Movable Ballast).
 - Boats with movable ballast, in the form of a canting keel or water ballast, may
 move that ballast to increase or decrease weight, or to change trim or stability.
 This changes RRS 51 (Movable Ballast).
 - RRS 52 (Manual Power) shall not apply to the adjustment of a canting keel or water ballast.
- 1.5 Yachting New Zealand Rules Performance Handicap Racing Fleet (PHRF) will apply to boats racing under PHRF and there is no requirement for a boat to have a PHRF rating.
- 1.6 RRS Appendix T Arbitration will apply.
- 1.7 Should there be any conflict between the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions the Sailing Instructions shall prevail. This changes RRS 63.7.

2 Sailing Instructions

- 2.1 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and the Supplementary Sailing Instructions.
- 2.2 The sailing instructions are intended to be available on the online official notice board by 2000hrs on Thursday 25 April 2024.
- 2.3 A copy of the sailing instructions and any advertising material to be displayed will be provided to each skipper at Registration.

3 Communication

- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at www.lbyc.org.nz.
- 3.2 [DP][NP] All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on channels 16, 17 62, and 77.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee may make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the sailing instructions. Failure to receive a radio message from the race committee will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 3.4 [DP][NP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 Eligibility and Entry

- 4.1 The event is open to all keel boats, multihulls, trailer yachts, sports boats and Elliot 6m class yachts.
- 4.2 To be eligible to compete under PHRF a boat must have a valid PHRF certificate registered with Yachting New Zealand no later than Saturday 20 April 2024.
- 4.3 There will be a non-spinnaker division and the organising authority may without explanation add divisions and assign boats to divisions and apply a general handicap for each boat.
- 4.4 Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form at www.lbyc.org.nz and paying the required fee by Tuesday 23 April 2024.
- 4.5 Late entries may be accepted upon payment of the late entry fee and at the sole discretion of the organising authority.
- 4.6 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements, including crew lists, and pay all fees.
- 4.7 [DP][NP] Each boat must have at least 50% female crew (including the helm), and the helm must be female.
- 4.8 All crew members (i.e. competitors) shall be a financial member of a club recognised by their national authority.
- 4.9 [DP][NP] A crew list for each boat must be provided to the organising authority prior to registration.

5 Fees

5.1 Entry fees are as follows:

6 Advertising

6.1 [DP][NP] Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority.

8 Equipment Inspection

8.1 The organising authority may conduct a safety inspection of any boat at any time.

9 Venue

- 9.1 The event will be held at the Lowry Bay Yacht Club.
- 9.2 Racing will be held in the Wellington Harbour.

10 Courses

10.1 Windward-leeward, triangle and harbour courses may be sailed.

11 Scoring

- 11.1 One (1) race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 11.2 A boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores.
- 11.3 Races will be scored on general handicap and the Yachting New Zealand PHRF Inshore Base handicap for eligible boats.

12 Support Person Vessels

12.1 [DP][NP] All support person vessels shall always have an engine safety cut out switch (kill cord) attached to the driver while the engine is running, unless prior written exemption has been provided by the organising authority.

13 Risk Statement

13.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury.

Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

14 Insurance

14.1 [DP][NP] Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$1,000,000 per incident or the equivalent. Certificate of insurance is to be presented upon request of the organising authority.

15 Prizes

15.1 A prize giving will be held as soon as practical after the last race on Sunday 28 April 2024 with prizes awarded at the discretion of the organising authority.
